Hypnotic Treatment of Chronic Pain from a Whole Person Perspective: Hypnosis and the Whole Health Model

Abstract Description (100 Word limit)

Although clinical hypnosis can be a powerful tool in helping individuals overcome chronic pain, it is often more helpful as part of a comprehensive approach to care. The presenters, pain psychologists using clinical hypnosis in the Veterans Health Administration, will offer a model of integrated care for chronic pain based in the VHA's Whole Health approach. Incorporating mind, body, and spirit into the care of chronic pain allows veterans to recognize how their lives can be rewarding and fulfilling despite their pain. Participants will practice several techniques that they might incorporate in their own work with individuals with chronic pain.
